District Recommendations for Funding
Non-Profit Organizations**

Applicant: Freestore Foodbank
Project Title: Fresh Food Initiative
Amount Requested: \$50,000
Recommended Funding: \$49,600
Timeline: Truck Purchase: January
Program: January-December
Project Summary: The Freestore Foodbank will purchase a 14-foot refrigerated truck to expand their pickup of frozen meat and other perishable food from Kroger stores. The food is edible but would otherwise be thrown away because it is no longer saleable. The number of participating Kroger stores will increase from 5 in January to 20 by September.

Applicant: National Underground Railroad Freedom Center
Project Title: Freedom Center Office Paper Recycling Program
Amount Requested: \$400
Recommended Funding: \$400
Timeline: January – December
Project Summary: The Freedom Center will continue recycling paper in their offices and expand the program to include public area paper recycling.

Applicant: Easter Seals Work Resource Center (WRC)
Project Title: Building Value Marketing Enhancement
Amount Requested: \$14,000
Recommended Funding: \$0
Timeline: N/A
Project Summary: The District does not recommend funding for WRC because the proposed project is not a District Priority. WRC has also received funding from the District for the past three years which makes their application a low priority. WRC wanted to expand Building Value's market recognition by purchasing three signs to place around the facility to improve visibility of the site from several different angles.

Applicant: City of Cheviot
Project Title: Refrigerant Recovery Service
Amount Requested: \$2,364.44
Recommended Funding: \$2,364.00
Timeline: January - December
Project Summary: The City of Cheviot will train one of their Public Works' employees in refrigerant recovery techniques and purchase the necessary equipment to offer Cheviot residents free appliance recycling. Residents will call the Public Works Department to arrange an appliance pick-up.

Applicant: Crosby Township
Project Title: Crosby Township RECYCLES!
Amount Requested: \$23,522
Recommended Funding: \$10,140
Timeline: Promotion and recycling drop-off: January - December
Project Summary: Crosby Township will add an additional recycling drop-off in the township near a new housing development. The township will also promote both their yard waste and recycling drop-off sites to residents.

The District is not recommending funding \$12,232 for Crosby Township maintenance and administrative staff time to operate the yard waste collection program. The District is also not recommending funding \$970 for the supplies to install a fence around their yard waste site. The yard waste collection program was previously funded by the District so it is lower priority.

Applicant: Forest Park Environmental Awareness Program
Project Title: Large Appliance/Metal Recycling Drive
Mixed Paper Drop-Off Promotional Campaign
Used Tire Collection Drop-Off
Computer Recycling Drop-Off
Amount Requested: \$6,800
Recommended Funding: \$6,800
Timeline: Large Appliance/Metal Recycling Drive: April
Mixed Paper Drop-Off Promotional Campaign: January - December
Used Tire Collection Drop-Off: September
Computer Recycling Drop-Off: Summer
Project Summary: Large Appliance/Metal Recycling Drive- Forest Park will work with the Village of Greenhills to pick up appliances and metal items at the curb from residents. Forest Park will contract to remove Freon from refrigerated appliances and recycle all of the metal.

Mixed Paper Drop-Off Promotional Campaign- Forest Park will install five small directional signs to help residents locate the paper recycling drop-off locations.

Used Tire Collection Drop-Off- Forest Park will work with Greenhills to host a used tire recycling drop-off for residents of both municipalities.

Computer Recycling Drop-Off- Forest Park will promote, collect, and transport computers from residents to the District's computer recycling collection event.

Applicant: City of Mt. Healthy
Project Title: Mt. Healthy Resident Refrigerator/ Freezer/ Air Conditioner Collection Program
Amount Requested: \$1,711.98
Recommended Funding: \$1,712.00
Timeline: Winter and Spring
Project Summary: The City of Mt. Healthy will send a Street Department employee to a training course for refrigerant removal and purchase the necessary equipment for refrigerant removal. In the winter and spring residents will schedule pick up of unwanted appliances with the Street Department.

Applicant: City of Norwood
Project Title: Chipping Away at Yardwaste
Amount Requested: \$20,000
Recommended Funding: \$20,000
Timeline: January - December
Project Summary: The City of Norwood will purchase a chipper to recycle large limbs and trees into mulch for city property. Material chipped will come from park maintenance and also when private trees fall into public right of way from storms or age.

Applicant: Whitewater Township
Project Title: Keeping Whitewater Township Clean
Amount Requested: \$7,389.36
Recommended Funding: \$7,389.00
Timeline: April and Fall
Project Summary: Whitewater Township will offer a Cleanup Day for residents to drop-off unwanted items like scrap metals, yardwaste, and tires.
