Last year, only 1 of the 5 schools recycled paper. Hughes Center would like to expand their current recycling program to all 5 schools and add cans and plastic bottle recycling. Work study students and multi-handicapped classes will be collecting the recyclables. By extending recycling to the entire school, Hughes hopes to meet the following 3 goals. 1) Educate students, staff and parents to increase the recycling at school and at home. 2) Provide work study jobs for students. 3) Reallocate at least one solid waste dumpster to a recycling dumpster by the 2006-2007 school year. Grant funds will be used to purchase printing of educational and promotional flyers, and Rumpke's monthly service fee for 2 recycling dumpsters. Total amount requested is 1,885.00.
2	Purcell Marian High School Martha James 751-1230	\$1,065	\$2181	Purcell Marian High School currently has 550 students and 75 faculty and staff. Purcell Marian would like to begin a school wide recycling program, in which it is estimated that the school's solid waste disposal could be reduced by 300-400 pounds a week. About 80% of the student body will be directly involved in the recycling program, whether it is through promotion, execution or organization. Grant funds will be used to purchase collection bins, a floor scale, printing of educational and promotional flyers, and Rumpke's monthly service fee. Total amount being requested is \$1,065.00
3	St. Bernard-Elmwood Place High School Josh Singer 482-7100 x 253	\$740	\$4824	St. Bernard would like to begin a school wide recycling program which will be ran and organized by the students of Career Education, a vocational program, which trains students in a variety of vocational skills. A recycling club will be formed to build awareness, plan events and to sustain the program after the grant money runs out. Grant funds will be used to purchase collection containers and Rumpke's monthly service fee. Total amount requested is \$740.00.
